Nuestras Raíces Inc. is not itself turning 50. The milestone recognizes five decades of community-rooted Hispanic heritage celebration in Delaware and the long-standing Festival and Parade tradition that has united generations through culture, pride, education and service.

Delaware to Mark 50 Years of Hispanic Heritage, Growth and Impact with Landmark Two-Day Celebration

Theme “Together We Are America | Juntos Somos América” unites concert, cultural celebration, parade and community outreach across Wilmington.

WILMINGTON, Del. — August 14, 2026 —

Delaware will commemorate 50 years of Hispanic heritage celebration September 12–13 with a landmark weekend of music, culture, community and pride in Wilmington. Led by Nuestras Raíces Inc., the 2026 Wilmington Hispanic Heritage Festival & Parade will honor the people who built this tradition, recognize today’s community leaders and create a vibrant platform for the next generation.

Under the bilingual theme “Together We Are America | Juntos Somos América,” the anniversary campaign reflects a simple and powerful truth: Hispanic heritage is part of the American story. The weekend will bring families, artists, businesses, elected officials, nonprofit partners and community advocates together around cultural preservation, visibility, service and shared belonging.

“This golden milestone belongs to the community,” said India S. Colon, Vice President of Nuestras Raíces Inc. “We are honoring the legacy of those who created spaces for Hispanic culture to be seen and celebrated while building a future rooted in leadership, education, unity and opportunity.”

Saturday, September 12: Concert & Cultural Celebration

The weekend opens from 12–6 PM at the Delaware Art Museum with the Hispanic Heritage Concert & Celebration. The program will feature Frankie Negrón & Friends, live music and cultural performances, food vendors, family activities, artist showcases, community resources, awards and an America 250 tribute. The museum setting connects visual art, performance and community storytelling in one accessible celebration.

Sunday, September 13: Parade & Calle 4 Fest

The celebration continues from 12–4 PM along West 4th Street with Calle 4 Fest and the 50th Anniversary Grand Parade. Calle 4 Fest opens at noon, and the parade steps off at 1 PM, traveling from Greenhill Avenue to North Jackson Street. Folkloric groups, marching units, elected officials, community organizations, sponsors, youth, businesses and families will fill the corridor with culture and civic pride.

Honoring Leadership, Service and Community Impact

The 2026 parade will recognize leaders whose work reflects service, advocacy, education, empowerment, business leadership, cultural preservation and media impact. Major Edna L. Alroy will serve as Grand Marshal; Carlos A. Dipres Ramírez will serve as Padrino; and Cristina Tlaseca will serve as Madrina. Leadership honorees Yvette Santiago and Yvonne Deadwyler will also be recognized alongside a diverse group of Community Champions and organizational honorees.

The anniversary is designed as more than an annual event. It serves as a gateway to year-round outreach and free community support. Nuestras Raíces creates culturally rooted spaces across Delaware, connects families with resources, invites public agencies and nonprofits into trusted community settings, advances cultural education, supports youth and artists, and builds partnerships that continue beyond the festival weekend.
